Compelling Christianity

What is compelling about Jesus Christ? For me, it is what I experience in Christ that I do not experience anywhere else.

In Christ, I hear about the Creator God, who shaped and shapes us with love. God's creative love is at the heart of things. God's creative image is stamped on every human face. I don't hear that message anywhere else. It resonates with something deep inside of me.

In Christ, I hear about a love so powerful, it sets human beings free to talk about their sin. People without that grace are afraid. They feel they have to protect themselves. Fearful hiding or aggressive violence then come to dominate their lives. In Christ, we find a sense of equality – we are all sinners. And so we all can examine ourselves and our world and tell the truth. We really do things that dominate, harm and destroy others, and that destroy God's good creation. We can face up to ourselves, in Christ. Faith unites us in truth and in our being judged by God, as Christ reveals, with grace. I don't hear about that passion to tell the truth any place else. And I sure do not hear about God's grace anyplace else.

In Christ, I hear of a type of love willing to suffer for the sake of others. The world is full of suffering people, but for the most part, they are ignored. In Christ, I hear about a life lived in ways that take on the hurt of the world. Suffering redemptively the theologians call it. It's a way of living with the deepest compassion, courage and hope. I don't hear about that any place else.

In Christ, I hear about death and resurrection. Death is the most devastating fact of our existence. It is so feared, people do not even talk about it with family members. How can they? It is too much. This all changes when you hear the Easter story, and are confronted with the power of Jesus' resurrection. The deepest, most feared reality of our existence takes on a whole new meaning in Christ. We have hope of love and life neverending. The whole world needs to hear the resurrection story. I need to hear that story. It changes everything.

I just don't hear anyone else talking about these things. I mean, anywhere – not in our zoos, parks or golf courses, not in the curricula in schools, not on the agenda at business meetings, not in the stock market's rising or falling, not in the chants of big sports events, not in the stories or the ads in newspapers or the internet. Only in the revelation of Jesus. Only in Christ's church.

We are journeying through the story of the crucifixion. And then the world-changing story surprises us yet again — Easter. The resurrection of Jesus. It is breathtakingly unique. It is compelling. It is ours to celebrate!




