Looking to a wonderful autumn season!



## **CREATIVE ARTS CAMP 2015**

BIG UNDER THE SEA ADVENTURE! concluded a successful week on Sunday, July 19 with movement, skit, and songs. Throughout the week, 87 children participated in the arts camp and enjoyed the ocean-themed activities. The children explored the main scripture "I will bless you with a future filled with hope — a future of success, not of suffering." (Jeremiah 29:11)

Submarine Captain Cynbad (Cyndy Maddux) and Jewel the Dolphin (Marge Tomlinson, puppeteer) led the morning assembly sharing God's Word with their strong commands. The divers (the CAC children) helped Jewel conquer her fear & unwillingness to swim deep through the week following each day's focus.

One of the strengths of this camp is the availability of specialized teachers from the community: Sarah Brown (movement), Samantha Matulka (music) and Jana Sesow (art). Their dedication to encourage the children to express their individuality through creativity is exceptional. These teachers make themselves available to teach CAC every year. We are very grateful for their passion to teach children.

This camp would not have been as successful without the help of the many volunteers! The decoration crew met several days in the months leading up to CAC in order to make the set and props. Other volunteers helped with registration, preparing for art and craft classes, setting and resetting rooms, making and serving snacks, and leading children. CAC 2015 was blessed to have over 30 adult volunteers and 20 youth leaders. About a half of the youth leaders were "Graduates" of CAC. 
## **NEW HYMNAL "GLORY to GOD"**



## Genesis Sunday: Annual Book Sale



## **Reversing the Walls of Jericho**

This is the first time we've been able to build a Presby-Home for a Presbyterian family, so we're REALLY excited! The Jony family has been selected to live in this home, and are members at First Presbyterian Church! Join us at 330 NW 15th St in Lincoln for a Wall Raising Party on Saturday, August 8th! The wall raising starts at 9 am, with a short service.

Originally from Sudan, Nyakoang Jony has lived in the U.S. for 20 years, and Lincoln since 2007. Nyakoang has worked at Cooks (Farmland Foods) for 6 years to support her family. She is a single mother of 5.

Interested in donating— there's still fundraising to do! You can make a donation to Homestead Presbytery and designate it for the PresbyBuild. Another option would be to buy a \$12 t-shirt, which is available for purchase between services at Westminster. All money from the shirts goes to the PresbyBuild AND you can volunteer on site in fashion.

If you're interested in being one of those fashionable volunteers (or just, you know, a regular volunteer– cuz that's cool too) and are 16 years old or older, then you can work on site! There's no experience needed– just call into Habitat for Humanity (402-477-9184) and ask for Michelle to sign-up to work on a Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday from now through mid to late October. You can sign up for a half-day, full day, or to bring food for lunch.

You may have noticed that Adult Education will host a special guest speaker, Alex Morse, who works with the Foods Resource Bank on Sunday, August 9th. But, did you know that we are also incredibly excited to welcome Ruth Farrell to the pulpit? Ruth Farrell is the Coordinator of Presbyterian Hunger Programs, former mission co-worker in Peru and Africa, and is the treasurer of Food Resource Bank. We have the pleasure of hearing Ruth preach during all 3 services on Sunday, August 9th.

If you want more, Saturday, August 8th is the Foods Resource Bank annual meeting at St. Paul's Methodist Church (M and 11th St) from 9 am to 3 pm. The Foods Resource Bank is a Christian response to world hunger; Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) is a proud part of this organization. The event is free and will include many workshops to help us understand what we, as a church, can do to become more involved. Westminster works against hunger every month through our Food Pantry, which supports 4 families.

Our Food Pantry tries to make up for the shortages that many families have in the way of food supplies. Summer is a busy time, and we often see a drop off in food donations. 
