The Session has called a meeting of the congregation for **Sunday, July 14** after 10:30 a.m. worship for the purpose of voting on a call to Jennifer Strickland as associate pastor at Westminster. We hope you will be able to be present at this meeting. Ms. Strickland will preach at both services. Following each service, there will be a reception in Fellowship Hall to give everyone a chance to meet Jen personally.

MEET OUR CANDIDATE

After eight months of research, discernment, and prayer, it is with great joy that your Associate Pastor Nominating Committee presents and recommends to you Jennifer Lyn Strickland as our candidate for Associate Pastor at Westminster Presbyterian Church.

Born and raised in a small town in Ohio, Jen graduated from Miami University in Ohio with a degree in Mass Communications and Creative Writing. She headed west to earn a Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing and a Master of Arts in English at Chapman University. It was upon completion of these degrees that Jen felt a strong call to ministry and moved to the East Coast to attend Princeton Theological Seminary. Jen graduated with her Master of Divinity in May of 2012 and moved to Kansas City to work for the Heartland Presbytery office before taking a position as the Interim Youth Director of Village Presbyterian Church.

During her time in New Jersey, Jen served the church in several positions that have provided a foundation of experience for ministry at Westminster. As a CPE Chaplain Intern at Riverside Methodist Hospital in Columbus, Ohio, she engaged one-on-one with patients, led interfaith worship, and developed the art of crisis ministry.

As a Pastoral Associate Intern at Broad Street Ministry and Arch Street Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, and later at Liberty Presbyterian Church in Delaware, Ohio, Jen had the opportunity to write prayers and liturgy in addition to sermons, and help plan and lead alternative styles of worship. She created and led One Community, a monthly congregational fellowship night, designed and led Bible studies, and taught adult education classes.

Jen currently serves as Interim Youth Director of Village Presbyterian Church in Prairie Village, Kan., a multi-staff church of 4800 members. In this position, she writes the curriculum for the confirmation class, creates lesson plans for Sunday School, and plans and leads high school and middle school youth groups. Jen also developed a creative fellowship program for middle schoolers at an ice cream shop and the Café Connection for high school youth. Jen supervises a staff of four and works with them to plan fundraisers for the youth department. She frequently serves as a guest preacher for churches in Kansas and Missouri.

Jen has served the mission of the PC(USA) by leading mission trips to the Dominican Republic and to Detroit. She led youth in serving meals at a community mission house, and served coffee and delivered clothing at a homeless café. Jen's internship at Broad Street Church in Philadelphia, where half the membership is homeless, provided a unique opportunity for outreach in an urban setting. At Village Church, Jen planned volunteer days at nearby retirement communities.

Throughout the years, she has served as a volunteer at summer camps and as an English as a Second Language tutor for disadvantaged children, worked on Habitat for Humanity projects, and volunteered at the annual Goodfellows Holiday Drive.

The primary areas of responsibility for the new Associate Pastor at Westminster are:

- Community building, with a special focus on young adults in the 20-40 age group;
- To help develop and grow a new alternative style of worship to complement the continuing traditional service;
- Adult education; and
- Outreach and mission.

From the very first video conference interview with Jen, the APNC has felt that she is uniquely qualified to provide leadership in these areas. When asked to identify three adjectives to describe herself, Jen chose "compassionate," "creative," and "genuine," and her warmth and compassion truly radiated right through that video connection. Her greatest passion in life is to "live out radical hospitality," deepening her own hospitality and empowering others to be hospitable, with a special focus on the 20- and 30-something age group. Jen's creativity, artistic talent, and experience as an actress complement her experience in planning and leading alternative styles of worship, and she is eager to develop and lead adult education that is interesting and intellectually stimulating.

On a more personal note, Jen loves good conversations, vegetarian cooking, foreign and classic films, reading, summer and autumn, writing short stories and sermons, snowboarding, spending time with her dogs and other four-legged friends, practicing American Sign Language, dancing, yoga, hiking, traveling to new places, Instagram, and thrift stores. Jen put herself through graduate school by working as an actress in commercials and print ads, and by

selling several short stories to literary magazines. She is outspoken about women's and minority rights.

Jen has an older brother named Eric; he and his wife Jonelle live in Orange County, Calif., and are expecting their first child this fall. Her parents, Ken and Kim, are both retired and live in her hometown of St. Marys, Ohio. Jen met fellow graduate Jacob Buchholz while both were students

at Princeton; they are excited to begin a new chapter of their lives together in Lincoln. Rev. Buchholz is the co-founder of a Deaf church in Kansas City and is the executive director of development for Deaf International, a Christian non-profit organization that works in the Deaf community.



Next month, Westminster will be visited by 14 of our friends from Lohmen, a village in the heart of the former East German Republic.

When Lincolnites made their first group visit to Lohmen, the year was 1989 and the Berlin wall was intact. The group from Westminster was still on the Communist side of the wall when it came down.

Dozens of Christians have traveled both directions - east to Europe and west to the United States - to share faith, cultures, and friendships over the years. Several constants anchor the visits there in Germany, or here in Lincoln:

- We always share rich times together in worship.
- We work side by side in mission.

- We enjoy friendliness and hospitality by scheduling the best activities to showcase local culture and daily life.
- We enjoy a delicious traditional meal prepared and hosted by the visitors.

This year, the group of Lohmen travelers includes pastors Brigitte and Michael Schleinitz. We are told Michael is an accomplished cook, so put Aug. 7 on your calendar for a fabulous German meal at *Veh Oh Veh* - how a German would pronounce WOW.

It has been our experience that German people are quite knowledgeable about American history, politics, and culture. Our visitors in 2004 descended on the Macy gift shop and nearly emptied it of souvenirs.

Most Germans also have a high fascination with Native Americans. It is our good fortune that the Indian Center will have a pow-wow during the Lohmen group's first weekend here in Lincoln; we plan to attend.

Several of the Lohmen teens indicate that swimming is a favorite activity, so we've planned a swim outing for Aug. 9 at Gene and Bess Armstrong's lake house.

Everyone is welcome to join these and many other activities. Please make a promise to yourself to make your perception of God's world bigger and more beautiful by taking part in any way you can. The next chapter of the Lincoln-Lohmen adventure will be written **Aug. 3-10**!

Every other month, Westminster volunteers cook and serve dinner for 100-130 people at **Matt Talbot Kitchen and Outreach**.


Cooks usually arrive at 3:30 p.m.; those who are serving arrive around 4:45 p.m. After dinner, volunteers clean the kitchen, wash dishes, and sweep the floor, usually finishing around 7 p.m.

It's Peanut Butter Month at the Food Pantry!

July has been designated Peanut Butter Month for the Westminster Food Pantry! When you shop for yourselves, please remember to pick up an extra jar of peanut butter (any type will do!) to donate to the pantry, along with your regular grocery donations.

If you've ever wondered about the journey a donated food item takes once it leaves your caring hands, consider a single jar of peanut butter. This jar arrives in the pantry donation box by the east entrance stairs at the church. Next, we place it with other jars of peanut butter on the pantry shelves. Six of these jars are packed in boxes each week by volunteers; these six boxes will be sent to six different families. Each week on Tuesday, a representative



from the People's City Mission makes a stop at Westminster and loads up those packed boxes to take back to the Mission, which keeps lists of local people who are eligible to receive one of these boxes of food. Unfortunately, the need for food boxes is greater than what can be provided by our pantry and others around the city. A family may only receive a food box once every two months.

You can help hungry local families! Remember to pick up an extra jar of peanut butter for the pantry when you shop this month. (You might consider a jar of jelly to go along with it, too!) Boxes with lids are also always needed for packing the food, and monetary donations (so we can supplement our food stores) are always welcome and needed as well.


