

PALM SUNDAY: JESUS ENTERS JERUSALEM

"Hosanna to the Son of David!
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
Hosanna in the highest heaven!"
— Matthew 21:9

Faith Village (9 and 10:45 a.m.)

Faith Village in March will center around the story of Jesus entering Jerusalem as the gathered crowd greets him with shouts of praise. Children will learn from the Gospel stories that Jesus is indeed "King of the Jews," but also that he is a different kind of king than the people of Israel expected or wanted. God does not always work in ways we expect or want. God's values are different from our own. What God intends for our lives isn't always what we want for ourselves. As children learn this story in their workshop and then participate in worship on Palm Sunday, they will be more fully engaged in the worship life of the congregation and what it means to us as Christians.

Faith Villagers begin each morning with songs and a chance to thank God for our blessings with an offering. Parents are encouraged to help their children make this a regular part of their Sunday morning routine. After large group time, children are divided into age groups and head off to workshops, which all center around a common theme.

Kindergarten of Eden (10:45 a.m.)

Children will continue to explore the stories of God's amazing love for us through songs, crafts, stories, and play. An offering for the Westminster Food Pantry is collected each week; children are encouraged to bring nonperishable items to help feed the hungry.

Palm Sunday Processional and One Great Hour of Sharing

All children age 3 through grade 8 (and their parents!) are invited to participate in the Palm Sunday processional on March 24; please assemble in Cole Hall by 10:15 a.m. "Fish" banks will be collected in baskets and carried to worship. We will process down the center aisle at the beginning of worship and sit on the floor in the front until the Children's Conversation. Children are then encouraged to attend Sunday school or may be seated with their families.

Since September of 2012, Small Groups Ministry has sponsored **History Buffs**, a gathering of people with an interest in history. This group meets once a month at 9 a.m. on Saturdays at the church, and attendance has ranged from 16 to 27 history aficionados. These meetings have been attended by church members and nonmembers alike, as the group is open to anyone with the common interest of history.

Previous History Buffs meetings have focused on such topics as: the journals of Lewis and Clark; the history of the federal prison system; the 1876 Battle of Little Bighorn; a private tour of the Nebraska State Capitol Building; and, most recently, the history of the Tuskegee Airmen.

On March 9, History Buffs is pleased to host Professor Ken Winkle from UNL for a discussion on former President Abraham Lincoln and the Thirteenth Amendment. History Buffs will continue to hold monthly meetings through May, break for the summer, and resume again in September. When life takes a turn toward the tough, there's a helping hand available: Member Care Ministry's Cook and Carry program.

"Cook and Carry was established to support our church family in a loving, caring way," says Dorrie Gage, Cook & Carry co-chair. "When a member is having a difficult time, perhaps due to illness, surgery, or a death or birth in the family, a meal is offered to help them out."

Sixteen volunteers plus co-chair Faye Moulton currently serve on Cook and Carry. Each volunteer buys and prepares food when needed, which is then delivered to members.

"It's not always possible to show our appreciation to someone who has done something kind for us, but serving on Cook and Carry is a way to pass on a kind deed to someone else," says Gage, who has served on Cook and Carry for three years. "It's personally very rewarding to participate in this ministry."

Gage notes that being part of Cook and Carry does not require a hefty time commitment; volunteers are usually only asked two or three times a year to deliver a meal.
