
Writings That Defined the Early Jesus Movement

The Essential Piece May 12





CELEBRATE YOUTH ACCOMPLISHMENTS!

Confirmation Sunday: May 19

Westminster will welcome youth confirmands as members of the congregation on Sunday, May 19. The 2013 class is the second group to experience the enhanced two-year confirmation program, taught by Dr. Christine Dempsey. This year's class explored three segments:

- 1. Who is a Christian? This section emphasized church history and identity. Youth studied the foundation of Christianity within the Roman Empire and how Christianity influences modern American values.
- 2. **Bible Tradition** Youth compared New Testament books in the context of the historical eras, with an emphasis on tying the Old and New Testaments together and understanding a living faith.
- 3. **Proclaiming Faith** Youth worked on their active faith in the third segment of the year's program. How to identify as Christians in a secular world was heavily discussed, as were church creeds and Presbyterian beliefs. Confirmands wrote their faith statements in this portion of the class.

The youth have given prayerful consideration and deliberation to their faith statements, and will share excerpts of those statements at both 8 and 10:30 a.m. services on May 19.



- If you buy an multipack of bedding plants at a nursery and only need some of them, the surplus plants would be a welcome contribution.
- If you have extra gardening tools or empty pots, consider donating them for sale, too.
- Most importantly, come shop for plants, and invite your garden-friendly friends and neighbors!

As in previous years, the proceeds from this sale will be used to support activities with the Lohmen group; this year in August, a group of 14 German friends will visit Westminster! Help support these endeavors and beautify your garden, too!
