# MISSION OUTREACH SPOTLIGHT: WESTMINSTER FOOD PANTRY

This October, as we approach Day of Discipleship, we hope each member of the congregation will consider bringing a food item (or several) to help stock our food pantry. The needs of the pantry are ongoing throughout the entire year; each week, 270 items are taken to People's City Mission, where they are distributed to six hungry local families. This food feeds three families of two, two families of three, and one family of four. The items we provide weekly are:

10 rolls of toilet tissue 7 packages of rice

13 boxes of Jell-O 6 packages of dry noodles

6 bottles of pancake syrup 16 boxes of macaroni & cheese

6 boxes of pancake mix 19 cans of tuna

9 bars of hand soap 7 cans of stew or chili

6 boxes of dry cereal 28 cans of fruit

6 boxes of oatmeal 37 cans of vegetables

6 bottles of cooking oil 6 boxes of instant potatoes

6 2-lb. sacks of sugar 15 cans of pork & beans

6 boxes of soda crackers 22 cans of soup

6 jars of peanut butter 7 packages of spaghetti

14 cans of Spaghettios 6 cans of spaghetti sauce

It's often asked which items are needed the most, but from the list above, you can see that *all* of the items are needed, *each week*.

All of these items are either brought in by congregation members purchased from the grocery store. The annual food drive meets our needs for only three or four weeks out of the year. This important mission of our church continues *every week of the year*.

Please remember the pantry each week as you do your own personal shopping. If each church family brings in a few items each week, it will make a big difference! Financial contributions are also essential for the continued success of the food pantry.

# Faith Village (9 and 10:45 a.m.)

Faith Villagers (grades K-5) begin each morning with a few songs and a chance to thank God for blessings with an offering. Parents are encouraged to help their children make this a regular part of their Sunday morning routine. After large group time, children are divided into age groups and head off to workshops centered around a common theme. October's theme is acceptance.

The Bible teaches that God's love is for everyone, and that all of us are created in the image of God. As God's people, we should love and appreciate others and be willing to learn from one another and work together. During October in Faith Village, children will learn that:

- We are all created in the image of God;
- We believe God's love is for all people;
- God's love is also for us we need to accept ourselves;

- When we recognize diverse and unique gifts, we can work together to serve God and others;
- It is important to not prejudge people;
- We can be sensitive to our own behaviors and/or language that may show prejudice;
- We can learn about and show appreciation for other cultures, countries, and peoples.

# Kindergarten of Eden (10:45 a.m.)

We are off to a new, exciting adventure this fall in Kindergarten of Eden! We will build foundations to help voung children learn about God's love for them. We will explore most of our Bible stories for two sessions; we do this so young children have an opportunity to learn by repetition. This fall, our Bible stories are about God's love, God's creation, Moses, the Ten Commandments, Samuel, and Isaiah. Each week, children are encouraged to bring an offering of nonperishable food for the Westminster Food Pantry.
