Art historian Andree Hayum says of the Isenheim Altarpiece, "this monument, once noticed, becomes an active presence in one's life." This sixteenth century twelve panel multi-stage polyptych from the hand of Matthias Grunewald surely represents one of the most powerful expressions of Christian faith ever painted. Literally and figuratively, it also corresponds perfectly to our forty day Lenten journey from Ash Wednesday through Good Friday to Easter. As guide and inspiration for that journey, on Wednesday evenings we will explore why Hayum calls this masterpiece "God's medicine." Following the WOW dinner we will meet in the Lounge.
