The Leavitts began to shed their ingrained notions of what Communists were like. As more stories and lots of laughter were shared, they began to perceive more similarities and a growing friendship.

It is common when these exchanges end to hope to see these friends again, and even more, to be as gracious as they were.

Even though the Lohmen group visiting us Aug. 3-10 is the most English-speaking group to ever travel to Westminster, an effort to listen for meaning and be as gracious as possible will still be important. Plan to be part of the next chapter of the Lincoln-Lohmen adventure!
