Wyvill served as the director of the Nebraska Health and Human Services Division of Developmental Disabilities and taught ethics courses at Kaplan University. He was also appointed to the U.S. Access Board under President Bush and served as Vice Chair of the Board. Previously, he was a legal counsel to Governor Mike Huckabee of Arkansas.
