Charitable IRA Rollover Renewed for 2014

The House and Senate have just renewed the charitable IRA rollover opportunity. The President is expected to sign the bill shortly. The opportunity is available only until December 31, 2014. This means there is very little time to take advantage of this great opportunity!

Provisions:

- IRA owner must be 70 and ½ years or older
- Can transfer up to \$100,000 directly from IRA to qualified charity
- Transfer counts toward required minimum distribution and is not taxable to the IRA owner

This is a very attractive provision for taxpayers who don't itemize or who are high earners and subject to the medicare tax. The direct transfer opportunity allows charitable donors to avoid inclusion of the transferred amount in their adjusted gross incomes.

"Gloria" In D major RV. 589 by Antonia Vivaldi

10:30 a.m. worship Today

The text of the Gloria is augmented from the Gospel according to Luke 2:14, the angels celebrated and announced the birth of Jesus Christ (which has been used in Catholic Mass most mornings). Vivaldi divided this into 12 movements. He used many text-painting (express words in music) like other Baroque composers. The main motif of "Gloria" goes back to perfect 8th (1 octave up and down) to express praise and joyful coming of Jesus. "Et in terra pax" (And Peace on Earth) has hesitating descending lines and chromaticism which depicts Christ's coming from Heaven with anticipation of His journey on earth – to the Cross. "Domine Fili Unigenite" (Lord, Son Only Begotten) has restless joyful movement in a fugue, somewhat describing Christ as a "mediator", on the earth working among us (staying in middle range). "Cum Sancto Spiritu" (With Holy Spirit) is in double fugue (like canon but in intervals). The fugue is used to express "perfect" – without end.

Looking for some light seasonal reading? Adult and children's books for the holiday are on display in the church library. Check out one or a few to add to the enjoyment of your Christmas celebration.
