## A Cool Church - A Hot Church

We found out how cold the Youth/Administration building can get when the furnace sputtered and died early last winter. And in this building, you can only run a few space heaters at a time - so the staff took turns having our toes get cold. Finally, they patched the furnace up enough to last through the winter.

As I write this, I hear the beat of reciprocating saws in the basement. The heat and air conditioner was put in before the building was finished, so there was no way to take it out whole. It has to be cut out piece by piece. That is underway. Then they will bring in a crane to take the air conditioner unit off the roof. The bad news is, it happened now. The good news is, the system lasted over forty years.

When a new air conditioning/heating system is installed, there will be dramatic difference in energy efficiency. The old unit was either "all on" or "all off," and it serviced every room in this building and the Garden Room, whether needed or not. It meant a lot of wasted energy, which did not seem to matter in the 1960's. Now, we know it matters significantly.

The new system will be made up of five different units, and each will be zoned for one area. So when the sun comes up, those rooms on the east side of the building can be cooled by its own small unit, while those in the shade on the west will not need to turn on until much later in the day. The hopes are that this will mean a 30-40% savings on heat and air conditioning costs.

This is a practical thing - it has to be done to use this building. But it also makes me think about how we practice our faith. It used to be, we thought we had to be "all on" or "all off." These days, we try to work more efficiently. We use our people-energy well. Our Session meetings do not take as long because our Committees are "zoned" to do the work for their specific area.

What we do know is, we need every one to participate fully when it is their time to be "on." It makes a difference. It's the only way it works.

Last year, we reignited the Westminster Foundation. If we had not done that at that time, and had such a great response, losing this furnace would have put us in something of a tight financial squeeze. As it is, we hope to finance the new \$140,000.00 heating and air conditioning unit with a "loan" to the church from the Foundation, which will be paid back over time. It will keep the Westminster Foundation financially strong, and help keep the church running smoothly.

Thank you for all your work for the church. Thank you to Jon Jackson for donating his time to design this new heating/air system. Thank you everyone for your gifts to the Westminster Foundation and its long-term support of this church. We are all working in our zones. And that is pretty cool.

## **Children & Families Ministry**

Our Kindergarten of Eden preschool friends meet in Room 210 at 10:45 AM. They explore stories from the Bible, learning about God's world and their place in it using the Growing in Grace and Gratitude curriculum. We believe this foundation of faith and love will shepherd them as they learn and grow.

Sunday at 9 AM, K-5th graders are invited to learn through teachings involving art, music, storytelling, and games. We will talk about "Respect: The Golden Rule & the Great Commandment". They will focus on respect for not only each other, but for ALL of God's creation.

In Faith Village, the K-5th graders are engaged in a rotating workshop model each Sunday beginning at 10:45 AM. During the month of April, our kids will reflect on "Respect: The Golden Rule & the Great Commandment". They will apply this concept to Creation Care's April focus on water. Reflecting on God's creation and how we can take care of His water & water creatures.



Nebraska Step Up to Quality is an Early Childhood Quality Rating and Improvement System. The Step Up to Quality Child Care Act was passed in June, 2013, by the Nebraska Unicameral legislative session. Nebraska now joins the ranks of over 40 states in the country that are in some phase of implementation of an early childhood quality rating and improvement system. The primary goal of Nebraska Step Up to Quality is to improve early care and education quality and increase positive outcomes for young children. This will be done through informing parents about quality early care and education programs in understandable and measureable ways. In addition, it will improve teacher and director effectiveness through training and professional development, formal education and coaching. Furthermore, there will be an emphasis on strengthening the understanding and use of standards, assessment processes, and using data to improve

quality. Nebraska Step Up to Quality will increase accountability for public funds that are being used to support early childhood programs.

There are 5 steps in the Step Up to Quality System. Westminster Preschool is currently ranked at a step 3 and has applied for a step 5 rating. There is currently one program, a home based childcare that is ranked at a level 5, we hope to be the first center based program to reach this level. We would also be the only program in the state to be NAEYC Accredited (National Association of Education for Young Children) and participating in the One Up to Quality initiative.
