The Westminster Foundation

The midyear update on the activity of the Foundation is as follows. The church had to replace a major part of the HVAC system and that project is almost complete. The church has incurred \$130,000.00 in expenses to date and another \$30,000.00 or so will finish this major installation. The Foundation operates to help the church when these major events occur. The Foundation is happy to say that we made gifts to the church to cover the cost of this project. It does however deplete the corpus of the Foundation and reduces the other gifts the Foundation will do in the future. Any donations you would make to replace the dollars in the Foundation would be very much appreciated. The Foundation wants you to know what we have been able to do to help the church achieve it's mission in the past. Over the last four years the endowment has made \$170,148.00 in gifts back to the church. The General Fund has made gifts in the amounts of \$306,616.00, for a grand total of \$476,764.00. The dollars come from a percentage of the Foundation's balance on a rolling three year basis. The Foundation as you can see has made a big difference in the life of Westminster.
