#### **CREATIVE ARTS CAMP 2016**

Galaxy Express concluded a successful week on Sunday, July 17 with their movement, skit and songs. Fifty-four children participated in the week-long arts camp and enjoyed the galaxy theme activities. The children explored the main scripture "God's majestic voice thunders God's commands, creating miracles too marvelous for us to understand." (Job37:4-5)

One of the strengths of this camp is to have specialized teachers from the community: Sarah Brown (movement), Samantha Matulka (music) and Jana Sesow (art). Their dedication to encourage the children to express their individual creativity is exceptional. These teachers make themselves available to teach CAC every year. We are very grateful for their passion for the arts and teaching children.

Many volunteers made this camp successful. The decoration crew met many days to make the set and props. Other volunteers helped with registration, preparing for art and craft classes, setting and resetting rooms, making and serving snacks, donating materials, and leading children.

#### **Sudanese Members Learn English**

The Sudanese members of Westminster reached out to the church to get help with becoming better with the English Language. We posted a message about this need in the Vine and it was answered by Dave Atkinson. Dave had become interested in helping individuals with English as a second language while in the military and had started the process of becoming a trainer with Lincoln Literacy Program. He now is currently teaching a class on Monday nights from 6:30-8pm. The plan is to continue the program at Westminster until the end of August when these two individuals can begin the English as a Learning Language (ELL) program geared for Refugees through Lincoln Literacy. This program runs from September — May and volunteer teachers help refugees to understand, speak, read, and write English. The two current students have been assessed by Lincoln Literacy for competency and Dave has started them on the ELL format. Let's give a big shout out to Dave for seeing a need and stepping up to help our Sudanese members.
