
Faith Building Blocks for 1st Grade Children:

Neighbor Helping Neighbor: Saturday, October 8th in the morning. Everyone is invited to join in reaching out to people in need in our community.

Food Pantry: For 25 years, Westminster has been feeding the hungry in Lincoln. Weekly, we provide food for six families. Pick up a list of needed items at the Food Pantry Box near the East entrance.

Gathering Place: Westminster serves 50 meals on the second Friday of each month from 4:45-6:15 pm. The Gathering Place, is a south Lincoln family support center.

Habitat for Humanity: All faiths including Westminster come together to put God's love into action by building a safe, and affordable home for a family each spring and summer.

Matt Talbot Kitchen Outreach: The first Friday of even numbered months, Westminster provides the meals that evening. The team prepares dinner on site, dishes it up, and then cleans up thereafter.

Disaster Recovery Team: Week-long mission trips are available for anyone in the congregation who is not afraid of travel, rustic living conditions and demanding work in a challenging spiritual climate.

According to John's gospel, Jesus' first question is, "What are you looking for?" If you are looking for the same old story, this class may stretch your comfort zone. We will discover anew how John's book contains an ethical spirituality that is at the heart of the moral life.
