It's been **30 years** since the mission project, "**St. Nick**", delivered its first Christmas gifts to 118 people in Northeast Nebraska. That was only the beginning of an amazing commitment the Westminster family has made, by providing gifts to nearly **13,000 people in Nebraska!**



"St. Nick" began as a mission, to provide for the less fortunate, but also to educate our congregation of the many underlying problems that many families face in rural communities. Caseworkers provide a brief history of the family (using fictitious names), which often indicate low incomes, health issues with no insurance, and loss of jobs, among many other barriers. With the gift choices provided, Westminster families have made it a tradition of shopping as a family and teaching their children that socks and warm clothes may be the only gift for some child. **Here are some ways you can support "St. Nick"!**
