Welcome Rev. Dr. Jimmy Shelbourn!

The Session is pleased to introduce you to our new Parish Associate, the Rev. Dr. Jimmy Shelbourn. Jimmy has been the pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Beatrice for the past 31 years. He grew up in Broken Bow and is a graduate of Hastings College. He received his Master's and Doctorate from Louisville Seminary.

His first call was in a suburban church in Louisville before returning to Nebraska in 1985. His doctoral work was in the area of adult education, and he has a passion for teaching. He is the longest serving pastor in Homestead Presbytery, and was recently awarded the Robert Giles Award for outstanding ministry.

Westminster established the Parish Associate position over 10 years ago with the Rev. Ellen Davis. Rev. Shelbourn will be calling on members of the congregation in coordination with the Deacons, Member Care and Dr. McDonald.

Rev. Shelbourn will be engaging in additional pastoral tasks, including teaching, preaching and building community within the congregation. The role of the Parish Associate is to assist the senior pastor in various tasks of ministry within the church. Dr. Shelbourn is enthusiastic about helping in whatever capacities will enhance the mission and ministries of Westminster. His first goal is to reach out to those who are homebound, and will begin these calls in early October.

Jimmy is married to Carol, and they moved to Lincoln in September. They have five children and eight grandchildren. Their son and daughter-in-law, Sean and Susan Mulvaney and their four boys, are members of Westminster.

Jimmy loves Scottish history. He has traveled to Scotland a number of times – one of his favorite places is the Isle of Skye. He plays the bagpipes, and will be sharing that gift this Reformation Sunday, October 30th. It is of note, this day marks the 499th year since the beginning of the Reformation. He will be preaching on October 9th. You are encouraged to join him in celebrating the light of Christ on that morning.

Sunday Adult Education Special Presentation U.S. State Department Officials - October 30th


