A diverse group of successful church leaders will share a variety of insights to help us rethink how mainline churches can move into the future. Outside Voices: Discipleship: Developing discipleship for all ages within your congregation. Dr. Susan Forshey, Dubuque Theological Seminary

Christian Education: What went wrong in Christian Education? How can we change it? —Dr. Ross Thompson, University of California, Davis. Nationally known educator and former Westminster member.

Mission: Patrice McMahon is an Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Her research is at the intersection of international security, conflict and human rights. She has written several books regarding the impact international aid organizations have in the world— whether the organization is wasting money or having a negative or positive impact. What can we learn from this? How will it inspire us to do mission differently?

Leadership: Richard Brown has been putting together his own leadership puzzle for his entire adult life. That includes his college years. He was one of two Midshipman selected to serve as an officer position as a junior. In his senior year, he was appointed as Midshipman Battalion Commander, the highest leadership position available to a student. Named the USMC Honor Graduate, he served his active duty as an infantry officer with the 1st Marine Brigade in Kaneohe, Hawaii. Prior to leaving the Corps Richard was selected ahead of his peers for promotion to Captain. In 1978, he began a thirty year career in sales with Pfizer, Inc. Four years later, he was one of the youngest individuals at the time promoted to District Manager. Richard helped found PRE, or Professional Resources Enhancement, in 1998 as a means of bringing his unique vision of leadership to small business, coaches, teachers, and young adults. Richard is now a certified speaker, coach, and trainer with the John Maxwell Team. In 2012, Richard published the book "Become THE LEADER Your PEOPLE DESERVE."
