

Parish Associate – Dr. Jimmy Shelbourn – will explore "People Encountered on the Journey to Jerusalem." In Lent we retrace the steps of Jesus from Galilee to Jerusalem and the Cross. 2017 Annual Session Retreat

The Westminster Session will hold its annual retreat at Lied Lodge on Jan 20-21. The leaders of the church will spend these two days discussing the future of Westminster, with a special focus on the coming year. We will set goals for every committee of the church, and look for steps on how each can achieve their particular goals.

Equally important, by the Session taking the time to have this extended discussion, we come to know and trust each other. We listen together for where the Holy Spirit is calling us. We come to consensus about what our top priorities are for the church. This focus from the Session is helpful for the church staff, as they are given the direction to actively work toward these goals.

Finally, after we set the goals, the Session convenes its January Session meeting, and sets the 2017 church budget. The size of the budget determines which priorities can receive the financial support that is needed. It is based on this extended discussion.

If you would like to know what you can do to help, there are three things to consider. If you see one of the Elders, tell them you appreciate their hard work and dedication. Second, if you have a vision for the future, talk with them, and share your ideas. Third, make sure you have your 2017 pledge in to the church office.
