Dr. Andrew McDonald Is the 2017 Homesteader of the Year!!

The Giles Outstanding Homesteader Award, named in honor of the Rev. Robert Giles, former Stated Clerk of Homestead Presbytery, honors clergy or laity in the Presbytery who have made outstanding contributions to church and community life, particularly for service at the presbytery level. The recipient for 2017 is our pastor, Dr. Andrew McDonald.

Dr. McDonald has served for 19 years as Pastor of Westminster, the largest congregation in the Presbytery, holding a number of offices, including moderator of the Presbytery Personnel Committee, past member of Council and past moderator of the Nominations Committee, Chair of the Executive Presbyter Search Committee, and Major Gift Campaign for Camp Calvin Crest. He is an active member of Rotary Club International and active in TED Talks.

He was chosen for this honor specifically because of his leadership in planning and hosting the annual Church Growth Summit. This event is not only for Homestead Presbytery, but includes delegates from churches in Missouri Valley Presbytery and Central Nebraska Presbytery, as well as ecumenical delegates from other denominations. The quality of leadership that he recruits each year for keynote addresses and leading sessions at the Summit is outstanding. The Summit is a means by which Dr. McDonald insists indefatigably that we Presbyterians must keep the task of evangelism before us as a priority. And he exhibits this dedication to church growth in the practices of Westminster Church.
