Dear friends and sisters and brothers in Christ –

I write a cover letter for *the Messenger* that I would never have expected to be writing a few short weeks ago. When Dr. McDonald first told me about the summons to be Transitional Pastor at House of Hope in St. Paul—eight days before the Session was informed—he said,

"I hope you have a good Easter sermon, because you are gonna' be preaching!"

It was unexpected that I would need to fill in this gap for a few months between that resignation and the arrival of our interim pastor. I made it clear that I would not be a candidate to be the Interim Pastor. But I was ready and willing to hold the "wheel of the ship" until we have the person who will help us move toward the next phase, when Westminster calls its 14th called Pastor since the charter of the congregation in 1905.

There is a member of this congregation who was in my first confirmation class in Beatrice in 1986. Several weeks ago, commenting on how my retirement from Beatrice turned out to be good for Westminster, he said, "I think it was in the plan."

My response was, "It wasn't in <u>my</u> plan!" Matt replied, "I didn't mean *your* plan." I think I must have taught him some good theology in that 1985-86 confirmation class!

In a letter that Jeremiah wrote to the Jewish exiles in Babylon, his trust in God's faithfulness led him to an anticipation of an eventual end to the exile, but his sense of reality kept him aware that it would not be "the day after tomorrow."



In that epistle he told them:

Surely know that the plans I have for you, says the Lord, are plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.

When you call upon me and pray to me,

When you call upon me and pray to me, I will hear you.


When you search for me, you will find me, as you seek me with all your heart. (Jeremiah 29:11-13) May those words for the exiles be alive in us as Westminster is in transition.

Over the years the management of the sale slid under the Lohmen umbrella and folks active in that project took care of the details and used the earnings to host our German visitors or finance a gift and provide a church-wide American meal while in Lohmen.

This July a youth contingent is traveling to Germany and WPC youth will be working Hostamania to supplement their trip. What shoppers spend on donated landscape plants will be a welcome shot in the arm for these young international travelers. It is a remarkable thing to get to do.

Hostamania is always on Mother's Day, and you will see a fine array of mostly perennial plants. The relaxed pricing means shoppers are expected to pay a fair price yet still get great bargains.

LOUNGE RENOVATION BEGINS MAY 16

Thanks to the efforts and support of our congregation, the renovation of the Lounge is scheduled to begin May 16th! This multi-purpose room will be transformed into one that is warm and inviting, creating a coffee shop atmosphere.

The renovation will include:

Replacement of the paneling with drywall, which will be painted a warm, neutral color; replacement of the carpet with tile that will simulate a wooden floor; and installation of new acoustical ceiling tiles, recessed LED lights, and speakers. We would like to purchase more comfortable chairs if the budget permits.

Renovations to the walls are as follows:

The North Wall (to the left as you walk in the room) will include a coffee bar, new kitchenette, and storage space. The East Wall will have new shutters installed over the windows. The South Wall will feature artwork, selected by Karen Janovy and Nancy Dawson, that will showcase Westminster. The West Wall (to the right as you walk in) will feature a sorely needed upgrade to the technology in this room. A 75-inch Smartboard will be installed, which will be adaptable to any type of computer for presentations. It can also operate as a whiteboard or a monitor for showing movies.

The Lounge is used almost daily. Adult Education classes, various ministries, committees, and other groups use it throughout the week. Importantly, the Lounge is where we host speakers including state senators, university officials, and numerous other professionals. We believe that creating a welcoming environment in this room is vital to the future of our church – for new members as well as future generations.
