Westminster Preschool will kick off the 2018-2019 School Year on August 13

As another school year approaches, we reflect on the past year and celebrate some of our successes. Westminster Preschool was the first and only program to achieve a level 5 rating from Nebraska Step Up to Quality, the highest rating possible. We also maintained our NAEYC Accreditation for another year, making us the only Accredited/Step Up to Quality Level 5 program in the entire state of Nebraska! We had a graduating class of 42 children who are headed off to 18 different schools across Lincoln and the surrounding areas. In the Fall we had so much fun creating artwork for the art show and singing for you in worship-we will do it again this year! In the winter we played in the gym quite often as we thought winter would never end! We had a wonderful winter program for our parents and over 300 people came to watch us perform. In the Spring we hatched 20 baby chicks and 1 baby duck, it was the highlight of our year. The Preschool formed it's first ever Westminster Presbyterian Preschool Advisory Committee. Susan Mulvaney, Karen Janovy, Emily Shelstad, Dan Hoffman, and Suzanne Schneider. We hit the ground running and have already tackled several projects and look forward to strengthening the partnership between the Preschool and Westminster Presbyterian this year.

Women's Choir | Sunday, August 5



experience daily life without worrying about exposing their feet to soil-transmitted diseases and rough terrain.


The shoes have arrived and have been added to the clothing that our Sudanese members will be sending when the drive is completed.

What is your favorite aspect of being a deacon? Being helpful!


What do you like to do for fun? I like to go to concerts, movies, read, travel, and play with my grand children!




BIGS BOKS
