Why Do Presbyterians Celebrate Lent?

Lent is a religious observance in the Christian calendar that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends approximately six weeks later the day before Easter Sunday. The purpose of Lent is full preparation for Easter. It is a season set aside to prepare the heart and soul for the joyful celebration of Easter through prayer, repentance, acts of benevolence and self-denial.

Since Lent is not specifically taught in scripture, Presbyterians are not obligated to do anything, but those who want to observe Lent are encouraged to add a spiritual discipline to their lives rather than giving something up. The addition of a daily Bible study, "Awakening to God's Beauty", as offered at Westminster through small groups or acts of service as volunteerism are great ways to enhance our spiritual growth through the season of Lent. Other spiritual disciplines that you may find valuable may be trying to be more Christ-like toward one another, a humble spirit at work, and expressing gratitude daily.

Let each of us begin our spiritual journey with Jesus to the cross as we receive the imposition of ashes on our forehead on March 6, Ash Wednesday and hear the words "You are dust and to dust you shall return." Then we will go forward for the next six weeks carrying the suffering and death of Jesus in our daily spiritual disciplines as we serve others and give thanks. Then we will join to joyfully celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday, April 21.



NATIONAL COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS

Life Line Screening will be offering preventive health screenings on Friday, March 8, 2019. As part of the screening event, Life Line Screening will offer low-cost take-home colorectal cancer tests called FIT (Fecal Immunochemical Test). These tests are simple, accurate, and recommended for the early detection of colorectal cancer. According to the Centers for Disease Control, the risk of developing colorectal cancer increases with age. More than 90% of cases occur in people aged 50 and older. Other preventive screenings provided check for stroke risk, abdominal aortic aneurysms, and osteoporosis. Westminster Presbyterian Church is pleased to make these important screenings available by hosting Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings.

LENTEN STUDY GROUPS

Lent is a special time in the church year. We remember, consider and prepare to acknowledge Jesus' life and sacrifice on our behalf. One Lenten tradition is to "give something up for Lent". The idea is that the believer will be reminded of Christ each time they would have had a cup of coffee, or chocolate or whatever they gave up. Westminster is providing an opportunity to "add a discipline for Lent".

Consider these options: If you are in a church group that meets weekly, suggest that part of the meeting time be devoted to the Lenten study "Awakening to God's Creation" designed by PC(USA).

Sign up and participate in a Lenten group (6 weeks). They will meet at various days and times throughout the week. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 6.


