
NEEDED

SESSION REPORT

Two major actions were taken by the Westminster Session at its March 25 meeting. First was approval of a new Financial Leadership Council to better coordinate stewardship activities and control of church expenses. Its membership will include representatives of several session committees (Budget & Finance, Personnel and Building & Grounds), and a member of Foundation, the pastor and business administrator. The council will meet monthly with Elder Allen Wachter as its coordinator.

Second, was formation of a subcommittee to draft the Ministry Information required as one of the first steps in seeking a new pastor. Members include Emily Killham, Allen Wachter, Rob Otte, Sarah Baltensperger, Sandi Larson, Jim Kinkennon, Andrew Finkner, and Dan Schafer. Known as an MIF, the form details the status of the church, along with its future expectations, and the nature of the Lincoln community. Its completion and acceptance must precede the formation of a pastor search committee.
