Westminster Preschool Awarded \$49,500

Westminster Preschool is one of the providers that is receiving a new grant, and it will assist 10 children out of the 85 listed in the article (from the Lincoln Journal Star).

"3,665 children under age 5 in Lincoln live in families that fall below the poverty* threshold. Most children under 5 who live in families below the poverty* threshold live with single moms (54%), followed by married couples (36%), and single dads (10%). Lincoln Littles funding can support working families with a portion of tuition if they earn under 200% at the Federal Poverty Level.*"

Preschool Grant, Continued:

"A new fund created to help working families that don't qualify for state child care subsidies but still can't afford the cost of quality day care contributed \$524,000 to help fill the gap. The money — the first distribution from the child care fund in what will become an annual giving day — will go to 11 child care providers who have agreed to add a total of 85 spots for more children and use the money for tuition assistance for needy families. Two years in the making, the Lincoln Littles Early Childcare Fund is a partnership between the Lincoln Community Foundation and the Nebraska Children and Families Foundation. Others receiving grants are: KinderCare Learning Center, Educare Lincoln, CEDARS, Children's Place, World of Knowledge Child Development Center & Preschool, St. Mark's Presechool/KIDZONE, Fingerprints Child Development Center, and Kids First Inc."

SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETINGS ON APRIL 29 and MAY 13

April 29

*Current Membership was reported at 631.
*Over the first four months of 2019
expenses exceeded income by \$13,747,
and a concern was expressed for the

and a concern was expressed for the traditionally lean giving months of summer.

*Pastor Putnam reviewed the ten months she has served as Interim Pastor: adjusting staffing to reflect actual finances, restructuring Sunday worship schedule, altering Deacon duties to increase contact with church members, and eliminating non-essential services. She believes the main tasks of her interim work are complete and the church should be ready soon to elect a Pulpit Nominating Committee. *The Church Pillars Task Force presented proposed a Mission Statement, a Vision Statement, and the following proposed Core Values:

- 1) Be in community; 2) Growing the love & knowledge of God; 3) Find greater peace in life; 4) Make a difference in the world;
- 5) Promote environmental stewardship. Elders are to reflect & comment on the proposals before May 13.

May 13

*Four confirmands met with the Elders to present faith statements: Cael Dempsey, Mariah Janssen, Ansley Sothan, and Sierra Walker. The Session voted to receive them on May 19.

*Rev. Sue Coller of Homestead Presbytery's Committee on Ministry met with the Session and said that Westminster is ready to create a Ministry Information Form (MIF) and elect a Pulpit Nominating Committee. Dr. Coller will train the PNC after they are elected.

*The following motions were approved: 1) the Pillars Task Force prepare to hand their work off to the PNC; 2) The Nominating Committee begin the process of proposing members of the Pulpit Nominating Committee; and 3) The PNC is empowered to created the MIF.

*Tom Pappas & Gary Haller were named to attend the Presbytery on May 16 in North Bend.



Whose turn to do the dishes?

In 2007 Westminster made a commitment to stop using disposable cups on Sunday mornings. That was twelve years ago, and we've been using the cups out of our kitchen ever since—just like we do at home. Also, just like at home, someone washes the dishes after we use them. We are grateful for the volunteers who take a turn in the kitchen every few weeks. And we could use a few more hands.

The process works best with a team of two or three people, takes a total of maybe 30-45 minutes (some of that in the kitchen, some in the Garden Room) and is not difficult. Groups that are hosting a reception do their own set-up and clean up and also provide a couple helpers if plates and silverware are involved, so the job is almost exclusively cups and glasses.

Washing dishes is a humble but worthy task that can be accomplished by almost anyone. There are no special requirements—or exclusions—based on age, sex, pay grade or social standing.
