
MESSIAH ON MAY 5TH

On August 22, 1741, George Frederic Handel began work on a new piece of music for choir, soloists and orchestra. By September 14 – a mere 23 days! – Handel had feverishly produced the 260-page score for what would become the best-known sacred oratorio in the world: Messiah.

After a wildly successful premiere in Dublin, Handel met with resistance upon his return to London. Many Londoners felt an opera house unsuitable for the sacred text, and opera singers unfit ministers of God's word. It wasn't until charity performances at the Foundling Hospital chapel beginning in 1750 that Londoners embraced the oratorio. Through the end of his life, Handel organized annual performances of Messiah to benefit the orphanage, and he bequeathed to the organization a set of performance parts so that they may continue performances after his death.

On Sunday, May 5th, the Westminster Choir and friends will present the third portion of Handel's Messiah during 9:30 worship. Beginning with the soprano aria "I know that my Redeemer liveth", part three tells of Christ's victory over death for the redemption of all the world.



WOMEN OF THE CHURCH:

When you think of the Ten Commandments, what comes to mind? Have you ever thought of them as "Love Carved in Stone?" No, I doubt many have, but the author of the 2019-2020 Presbyterian Women's Bible Study has. Eugenia Anne Gamble is a Presbyterian pastor with 30 years' experience who is not only a preacher but also an author, speaker and retreat leader who loves to make the Bible come alive for others.

In the study, Gamble describes each of the commandments in contemporary terms that resonate with who we are and where we are in the 21st Century. For example, she translates "Thou shalt not covet" to "Don't fixate on What You Don't Have," which speaks to our need to have more and more 'stuff.'


