
# Presbyterian Women Fall Study

# Church Life Committee Life Group Surveys

#### **New Maintenance Protocols**

At the June 28 meeting, Westminster's Session approved a maintenance management contract with NAI FMA, a local property management company.

FMA has current contracts and experience working with churches. One part of our decision-making process was to be in contact with one of these congregations, and we learned they were very satisfied.

Westminster will have an assigned Maintenance Manager who will perform weekly walk-throughs of our facilities and perform routine maintenance, so you may be seeing a new face around the building soon. If you come across a maintenance issue in our facilities, please let a staff person know. Staff will have access to a 24/7 phone line for reporting issues. Thanks to our Personnel, Buildings & Grounds, and Finance committees for their work in securing these services.

#### Green@Heart Recommends: Tour the Wild Side - Using Native Plants in Your Landscape Saturday, August 21 and Sunday, August 22, 10:00-3:00 p.m. both days

Native plants support birds and pollinators by providing habitat and food and, in return, benefit from the birds and insects spreading seeds and pollen. Native plants also provide for the health and wellness of those living in sub/urban areas alongside the birds, bugs, and other creatures.

The Tour's goal is to introduce people to more "wild" and native yards and public spaces and learn how to create these important spaces. Several residential landscapes throughout the Lincoln area will be open on Saturday, and on Sunday you will be able to visit with local nurseries and see up-close public spaces where native plants are growing. Plant, bird, and insect experts will join the owners to help answer your questions and to explain why native plants, birds, and insects depend on each other.

# Are You Being Called?

As we worked our way through the books of I and 2 Samuel last month, I couldn't help but consider how these stories relate to the challenges of kids ministry and how hard it can be for us to serve as God calls us to. The Israelites had prophets like Samuel to directly relay His word, but even they somehow managed to fail to do the things that God asked. What hope do we have, then, of living up to the standard that God has set for us? How are we supposed to even know where to serve or how to get started in the first place? Well, while we may not have any prophets to tell us exactly what to do, God does still speak to us in other ways. We can hear God's calling in the people around us, through the inspiration we find in the bible, and sometimes even from within our own hearts. But no matter where we manage to hear God in our lives, we are each called to service in one form or another.

#### From the scripture:

1 Peter 2:9 "All people that have a relationship with God are called to serve God."

Romans 12:3-8 "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your[a] faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead,[b] do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

1 Corinthians 12:4-6 "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work."

So if each of us is called to serve and if each of us has been endowed with unique gifts to share with the world, then have you found the place that God is calling you to serve?

If not, we are looking to build our kid's ministry team and want you to get involved. And if you have already found your calling within the church, we would still love for you to share an aspect of your unique talents with our kids.

Now as we know from the Israelites, it can be challenging to answer a call to service, even when we know exactly what we're supposed to do. There are all kinds of reasons not to volunteer or not to serve since everyone is so incredibly busy. We may not think we have the time, or the resources, or the skills, or we might be held back by one of the following misconceptions about volunteering in kids ministry.

#### It's already under control.

Alright, everything technically *is* under control (that is my job, after all), but merely being 'in control' is hardly where we should aspire as a church. In spite of the fact that it may look like our kids ministry is full of volunteers who are great at what they do, we can always use more help. Having more people allows us to provide more personal attention to each kid and create stronger relationships. It also allows some of those other great volunteers to take a break every once in a while.

#### I've never taught kids before.

Teaching, for any age range and for any type of student, is a skill. And just like any other kind of skill, it is something that can be developed through training and practice. As a kids ministry volunteer at Westminster, we will provide you with all the resources and training you'll need to be successful, from essential supplies to a carefully selected curriculum that can help convey God's word in a fun and approachable way. If you are willing to take a chance, you might find this is a hidden talent you never even knew you had!

### Are You Being Called? Continued...

#### Kids make me uncomfortable.

That is completely okay. Many people feel awkward around kids and don't always know what to do or say, but that is all the more reason to get involved with kids ministry. We all too often forget that children are not simply future members in-training, they are a part of our church family *right now*. And just as we have a duty to welcome and support the adult members of our church (even the ones who are different from us in ways that might make us uncomfortable), so too do we have a duty to our children as well. But this is not just an obligation or a chore, it is an opportunity to build relationships with kids who see the word of God with fresh eyes and open hearts.

#### No one has asked me.

Then consider this your official invitation.

#### I don't have kids.

Being a parent is not a prerequisite for working with kids. In fact, you may be able to offer new energy and insight while providing a blessing for tired parents. There is genuine joy to be found in connecting with the youngest members of our congregation, and since we were all kids once, you'll automatically have something in common!

#### I have kids.

If you have kids then you probably do need a break, and volunteering for kids ministry means that you'll have to miss the in-person service sometimes. But the chance to share the church experience with your kids is an incredibly special, and limited, opportunity. By spending Sunday mornings with your kids and talking about God, you will simultaneously deepen your faith while building a stronger connection to your children. In the end, you can always watch the service later online, but you won't always have the chance to share church with your family.

In my reflections on the book of Samuel and how it relates to the challenges of kids ministry, I'm not certain I came to any firm conclusions. The Israelites frequently missed the mark in spite of the fact that they had clear directions, but the kids ministry volunteers that I work with -- guided by little more than a sense of calling -- never seem to let me down. So while answering the call to serve in kids ministry can be hard, simply trying and being yourself is almost always more than enough. Because, in so doing, you bring with you the full array of talents that God has given you to prepare you for this task.

Author Os Guiness once said that "God did not direct His call to Isaiah— Isaiah overheard God saying, ". .. who will go for Us?" The call of God is not just for a select few but for everyone. Whether I hear God's call or not depends on the condition of my ears, and exactly what I hear depends upon my spiritual attitude." So how is God calling you to serve?

# The Per Capita Connection

Westminster Friends,

Per Capita. It's a strange term. But if you look beyond the awkward wording, you'll see its more accurate meaning...Presbyterian Connection. Every year our church makes a per capita, or "per member", contribution to support the operations of our regional presbytery as well as operations of the national PC(USA) church office and general assembly. The per capita is the "*tie that binds*" to connect our Lincoln church congregation with the Presbyterian Church at large. Our giving to this fund brings Westminster together with over 9,000 other churches to:

- Partner with ecumenical bodies worldwide to promote Christian unity
- Witness on behalf of the church on social issues
- Provide funding to bring commissioners to General Assembly and other events
- Administer the Church Leadership Connection system for calling pastors
- Publish and distribute the Book of Order and the Book of Confessions
- Address issues of inclusion and representation across the church
- Support a portion of the Presbyterian Mission Agency and mid-council ministries
- Plan and host the biennial General Assembly

For 2021, Westminster is required to contribute \$46.10 in per capita dues times the total number of our active members as determined by Homestead Presbytery for the prior year. On behalf of the Session and the Financial Leadership Council, I ask each of you to consider a gift to support the per capita for each church member in your family.

The past year has taught us that our world is a whole lot more interconnected than we might have thought about just a couple of years ago. Your gift to the Per Capita allows us to protect pledge dollars for other activities while also helping empower our Connection to the broader church and make a difference in the world.

Gifts can be made by check or online via your Realm account where I just did... fast and easy. Also, so that we know to direct and recognize your generosity, please be sure to indicate "Per Capita" with your gift. Thank you!
