

From ushers and greeters to children, youth, and adult group leaders and everyone else in-between, Westminster volunteers use their God-given gifts to serve others on a daily basis. This committed group of individuals make everything we do here at Westminster possible, and this month we are highlighting a truly amazing and dedicated volunteer in our children and youth ministry program, Jana Dyer.

Elder and Deacon Nomination Form

"And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:17

Your Nominating Committee is in the process of seeking church members for consideration as Elders and Deacons to serve for the next three years. Your suggestions are extremely important in the candidate selection process. We encourage you to forward any recommendations that you may have.

What do Elders and Deacons do?

According to the Book of Order:

 \mathcal{S}

Elders are persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. They should be persons of wisdom and maturity in faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. They are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life of the congregation. Ruling Elders exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of the congregation as well as the whole church. They shall serve three years as members of the session meeting monthly. They will need to participate in and/or moderate a church committee.

The ministry of deacon is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming live of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgement should be chosen for this ministry. Deacons shall serve a term of three years, be assigned a "flock" (group of church members) they care for and communicate with. Deacons meet monthly.
