Join an initiative by and for faith communities focused on the significant role that trees play in our call to tend creation and to care for the least of those among us.

Celebrate all that we enjoy about trees and act on our responsibility to care for them, particularly in this changing climate.

Faith to Forest opportunities will include worship, education, stewardship and advocacy, within our faith communities and across the Lincoln community.

Each faith community is invited to participate as best fits its particular interests.

Plans to date include:

- Encouragement for each faith community to **have a Tree Sabbath worship service**, preferably in January or February 2022. The Faith to Forest website offers some suggestions for scripture, prayer, music, liturgy, etc.
- A call for individuals and faith communities to **plant and care for trees** in 2022 and/or to make a donation to plant and care for trees in Lincoln or globally.
- An invitation for volunteers to be trained by the Lincoln Park Department as *Prairie Pruners*, to **help young city trees get a good start**.
- **Discussions** within your congregation or in city-wide gatherings of a practical, inspiring book, *The Future We Choose*.
- Five Zoom presentations:
 - **Jan 6—Out on a Limb in God's Forest** Rev. Dr. Jen Strickland and Rev. Dr. Jacob Buchholz discuss why trees and the environment are issues requiring attention and action by people of faith
 - **Jan 13—Trees: Our Superhero Friends** Justin Evertson with the Nebraska Forest Service and Nebraska Statewide Arboretum gives a fast-paced overview of the economic value and physical and mental health benefits of trees, the value of native species, and how trees impact and are impacted by climate change.
 - **January 20—How to Love a Tree** Sarah Browning, Nebraska Extension, and Bob Hendrickson, Nebraska Statewide Arboretum, talk about choosing, planting, and caring for trees in Eastern Nebraska
 - **January 27—Introduction to Prairie Pruners** Lorri Grueber, Lincoln Parks Department, provides an overview, initial training, and next steps to joining "Prairie Pruners," a new volunteer program in our city parks
 - **February 3—The Future We Choose** Pat Leach, Director of Lincoln City Libraries, and Martha Shulski, Nebraska State Climatologist, offer their perspectives on the book chosen for community-wide discussion
- One or two **advocacy steps** for individuals and faith communities.
(Participating in other aspects of *Faith to Forest* will not obligate a faith community to take a public policy position.)
