The good news of Advent is that our waiting as a church is active anctipation, not just sitting around. This Advent at Westminster we will actively celebrate the joy of being back together during this season as a church family after a 2020 apart! Here are a few things I'm excited about for our church in Advent 2021...

- 1. **Advent Workshop after church on Sunday, December 5th.** There's more information in this Messenger, but Advent Workshop is a time for all ages to gather together, decorate cookies, sign cards, and participate in crafts. Whether you're 4, 40, or 104, I hope you will join us!
- 2. **Advent Taize services!** At 5:30pm on the Wednesdays of December 1, 8, and 15 we will gather for a 30-minute service of reflective music and prayer. I can confirm the rumor that I will be playing guitar for some of these, and I am excited to share in that way.
- 3. **Sunday Adult Education** I'll be leading a two-week class reflecting on ordinary objects that we find in scripture and in our own lives. This will be using the book Advent In Plain Sight by PC(USA) Pastor, Jill Duffield. I hope you'll join us after church December 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> in Fellowship Hall!
- 4. And, of course, **Advent Worship** at 9:30am in the Sanctuary! We will build to Christmas Eve in hopeful worship with inspiring music including guest musicians, sermons relevant to daily life, and members of our church family leading us in Advent Candle Lighting as we focus on the theme "**The Comfort of Advent: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love**."

#### YOUR HOMESTEAD PRESBYTERY MEETING NOVEMBER 2021

- Installed the new moderator, Terri Sherman.
- Stephen Earl, Presbytery Interim Executive, reported that the end of COVID restrictions means opportunity and a chance to look at everything anew. He, along with Presbytery staff, will be doing one-week residencies in various sites around the Presbytery. This will allow Presbytery staff and individual churches to more freely interact.
- Initiated a search for a Stated Clerk for the Presbytery upon the decision by the current Clerk, Raymond Meester, to retire.
- Approved the installation of a new pastor, Rev. Owen Derrick, at First Presbyterian, Tekamah. Also
  voted to waive certain requirements of pastorship since Rev. Derrick met those requirements in
  Scotland.
- Elected officers. Of interest, Pastor Chris as moderator of the Presbytery Disaster Response Team? And Margaret Sprude as a member of the Committee on Ministry. Margaret also is serving on the Search Committee for a new Stated Clerk for Homestead Presbytery.
- Approved the 2022 Budget.
- The Strategy Team reported that the consulting group, Leadership, will be assisting them in a survey of Presbytery churches as a final input for the Team as it completes its tasks. The hope is to have a final report to the Presbytery by year-end, including a staffing plan recommendation.
- Set dates for HP meeting dates for 2022: February 19, May 19, August 13, and November 17.
