A note on language: At Westminster (and as a PCUSA church), we value using *expansive* language for God in our worship. That means we refer to God in ways that appreciate the diversity of images for God found in scripture, as opposed to only calling God "he." When using historical confessions. we may at times use original language due to the words of the original writer(s). Today, we hold in tension our theological and pastoral value for expansive language while using a 500-yearold confession that refers to God as "himself," alongside adjectives describing God's character.
