

At Westminster, we strive to be a community of authentic welcome, embodied by living in love for God and our neighbors. The Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Foundations of Faith includes the following call to Unity in Diversity: "In Christ, by the power of the Spirit, God unites persons through baptism regardless of race, ethnicity, age, sex, disability, geography, or theological conviction. There is therefore no place in the life of the Church for discrimination against any person. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) shall quarantee full participation and representation in its worship, governance, and emerging life to all persons or groups within its membership." (Book of Order, 2019-2023, F-1.0403)

Presbyterian teacher Shirley Guthrie once wrote that the big word "theology" simply means "God Talk." One of our theological beliefs as Presbyterians is that our sin, or separation from God and neighbor, happens both in actions we do as well as inactions or things we fail to do. Failing to speak up against a wrong or injustice is a form of sin, or separation from doing good, in our lives.

In 1861, the words were adapted to music by another English clergyman, Rev. John, B. Dykes." In 1879 Rear Admiral Charles Jackson Train was a Lt Cmdr at the US Naval Academy in Annapolis and began the practice of concluding each Sunday's service at the Academy with the first verse of this hymn. 
