

CROP Walk | Save the Date: October 9

"Hunger is the greatest health risk in the world, killing more than AIDS, Malaria, and TB combined," said Reverend Gina Walsh-Minor, Rector Trinity Episcopal Church. "More than 925 million people, including 40 million Americans, don't have enough to eat."

In 2017, an estimated 1 in 8 Americans were food insecure, equating to 40 million Americans including more than 12 million children. It is important to know that hunger and food insecurity are closely related, but distinct concepts. Hunger refers to a personal, physical sensation of discomfort, while food insecurity refers to a lack of available financial resources for food at the level of the household. There is no single face of food insecurity. It impacts every community in the United States.

The Lincoln CROP Hunger Walk will take place on Sunday October 9.

CROP Hunger Walks were started in 1947 by Church World Services to help Midwest farm families share their grain with hungry families in post WWII Europe and Asia.

Westminster's *Green at Heart* ministry invites members to share what they see in their travels which support renewable energy and ecology.

Recently in Scotland, Jimmy and Carol Shelbourn saw a "sea" of wind turbines" in the North Sea, providing electricity to The U.K. grid. Wind above the North Sea is quite reliable.

Also seen were the massive reforestation efforts by the Scottish government so that any logging becomes sustainable. And strawberry farms now feature strawberries planted in table height soil containers, under translucent tarping as a greenhouse.

This extends the season for the teatime essential strawberry, while also preventing the harvesters from back injurious stooping.

A Big Day at Our Sister Church

Westminster Foundation Moving Forward

The sudden loss of Foundation President Ron Wachter has been difficult for the Foundation Trustees as well as the Congregation. Ron was a quiet leader and moved several projects forward. He is missed.

At the meeting held on August 10, 2022, Allen Wachter was elected Foundation Trustee to serve the remaining term of his father. This action will be ratified by the Congregation at the next Annual Meeting. Other actions at this meeting included election of Officers to serve until our next Organizational Meeting: President—Joyce Douglas; Secretary—Erika Schafer; Treasurer—Greg Hershberger. Greg Hershberger continues as Chair of the Finance Committee and Pat Leach as Chair of the Marketing Committee.

The assets of the Foundation as of August 9th, are \$3,572,780. Our portfolio is invested for the long term so market swings are noted but not of great concern. Since the Foundation is for the benefit of Westminster Presbyterian Church, we discussed the current elevator situation and cash needs associated with that repair. Even though an insurance claim has been filed, we are expecting the Foundation will need to assist in the payment for this repair.

Thanks to the thoughtfulness of generations of members, the Foundation continues to grow. Estate planning often contains funds to the Foundation as well as specific donations to funds of interest to a member. In the last ten years, the Foundation has grown from \$2,216,220 to the current amount of \$3,572,780 which in simple terms is growth of \$1,356,560. The exciting piece is not only the increase in assets over the ten years but the fact the Foundation as paid \$1,359,940 to the Church for repairs and other expenses.

HEAR! HEAR!

There are now two ways for you to enhance your listening experience in the Westminster Sanctuary.


You can use the hand-held devices which are available in the usher's closet. These have been available for several years.

Or you can use your Smartphone to connect directly to the Church's audio system This new program is a special wi-fi system, called *Listen Everywhere*

If your hearing aids have <u>Blue Tooth</u> and can be controlled by your Smartphone the system will work through your hearing aid earpieces.

If your hearing aids do not connect with your smart phone, you will have to use ear buds that are compatible with your phone in place of your hearing aids

The following steps will turn your Smartphone into an assisted hearing device.





ListenClear

1) Download the free App

At your home, or anywhere you have an Internet Connection, download the free *Listen Everywhere*. If you own an iPhone, go to the App Store and search for the *Listen Everywhere* app, OR,If you own an Android phone (Samsung, Sony, HTC, or LG), go to either Google Play, the Samsung Galaxy Store or the Amazon AppStore and search for the *Listen Everywhere* app.

2) Click on "Get" and then "Open."

The Listen Everywhere app will download on to your phone.



2. Connect to the Church's Wi-Fi System.


When you are in the Sanctuary, go to "Settings" on your Smartphone, then click on "Wi-Fi". You should see the *listenwifi* connection listed. Click on it.

The first time you connect, you will be asked for the password which is the same as the wi-fi connection listenwifi. After you initially sign on, you will not be asked again for the password.




3. Open the Listen Everywhere app that you downloaded at home.

You will see a screenshot of the church Sanctuary. After 15 seconds, click on "**Skip Ad**" (which will appear in the upper right corner).



This will bring you to the Listen Everywhere application. Tap on the "Tap to Listen" bar and you will be connected to the Church's sound system so you can hear the speakers and the music.



Please be sure to bring the headphones or ear buds that came with your smartphone so you can listen without disturbing others.
