Psalm 34's invitation to "taste and see that the Lord is good" is a central theme of our worship today, as we consider the ways that our practice of the sacraments lead us to experience and share God's goodness dayto-day.

This hymn was sung at the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953, a further reminder of our ties to Christian tradition globally!

The postlude, "Listen, God Is Calling," is based on a Swahili hymn from Kenya.
