Proverbs 1:20 proclaims, "Wisdom cries out in the street: in the squares she raises her voice," a reminder that wisdom guides Christian work of justice and peace in day-to-day life.

Affirmation of Faith (Confession of 1967; 9.49) God instructs the church and equips it for mission through preaching and teaching. By these, when they are carried on in fidelity to the Scriptures and dependence upon the Holy Spirit, the people hear the word of God and accept and follow Christ. The message is addressed to people in particular situations. Therefore, effective preaching, teaching, and personal witness require disciplined study of both the Bible and the contemporary world. All acts of public worship should be conducive to people hearing of the gospel in a particular time and place and responding with fitting obedience.
