Please welcome Rev. Dr. Carl Eskridge, our guest preacher this morning. Carl Eskridge, a native of North Carolina, graduated from St. Andrews University (NC), Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary (TX), San Francisco Theological Seminary (CA), and the University of Nebraska College of Law. Ordained by Homestead Presbytery in 1979, Carl was called as pastor to the Palmyra and Heritage/Lincoln Presbyterian Churches and has served Homestead Presbytery in many capacities during his 43-year tenure. He currently moderates the Session of the Wahoo/Czech Church and the Auburn Presbyterian Church and regularly preaches in congregations throughout the area. For 25 years Carl worked as an attorney for the Nebraska Office of Public Counsel/Ombudsman, retiring January 1, 2021. He also served two terms on the Lincoln City Council representing Central and NW Lincoln. In retirement Carl is an active mediator and serves on the boards of the Lincoln Electric Service, Community Action Partners, the Lincoln Library Foundation, the Nebraska Presbyterian Foundation, and the Administration and Finance Committee of Homestead Presbytery. Carl's wife, Janet Hannah Eskridge, is an artist and an active community volunteer. Carl and Janet were married June 1, 1974, and they have 2 daughters and 4 grandchildren, three in Omaha and one in Nashville, TN.
