


# **HAPPY NEW YEAR 2023**

## **New Year's Resolution**

It's hard to change a habit of many years, but this one would be worth the challenge. It's a win-win for both your planet and your pocketbook.

#### **Top Ten Reasons to STOP Letting Your Car Idle**

- An idling car releases the same volume of emissions as a moving car.
- If you are stopped at a light or in a drive through for over 10 seconds, it's more economical to turn off the engine, then restart it.
- Driving warms up your engine twice as fast as idling.
- Easing into your drive warms the cabin of your car faster than idling.
- It does not take more fuel to turn off the engine and then restart it.
- Frequent restarts are not hard on your engine and battery. This was true only with early model cars.
- The cost of fuel consumed in idling can exceed the cost of frequent restarting by 300% to 500%.
- The occupants of an idling car are breathing any exhaust that leaks inside.
- Asthma, heart disease, chronic bronchitis, and cancer are linked to the pollutants released in tailpipe emissions.
- God has given us minds and consciences and an imperative to take care of Creation. Minimizing unnecessary idling is a small but important behavior that's worth considering as we make strides to responsibly care for Creation.

The onset of winter may be the hardest time of year to initiate this practice, but then again, it might be just right.

These ideas are attributed to the Environmental Defense Fund except for the last one—- which comes from the Bible.
