Diaper Collection at WPC

According to the National Diaper Bank Network, 1 in 3 American families report experiencing diaper needs. Despite this strong need, there are no federal or state programs which provide funding specifically for diapers. In 2020, the Junior League of Lincoln started The Diaper Bank to

provide diapers to the 6,000+ children in our area. Through fundraising and the support of the community, we are able to collect unopened packs of diapers to distribute to those in need. The project is currently thriving and growing. In 2021 alone, we received over 53,000 diapers of various sizes and nearly 14,000 wipes. These supplies mean parents can take their kids to daycare with disposable diapers while they go to work and earn a living. The need is still there and we are excited to continue serving it. From February 1st-15th we are hosting a diaper drive! You may drop off packages of diapers at the east entrance. Doors are generally open from 10 am to 2 pm (9 am to 1 pm on Tues.) and 5 – 7 pm during the week and Sundays from 9 – 11 am.
