Where will we worship? Worship will take place in the Westminster Gym (with entry on the preschool hallway across from Faith Village).



What will our worship look like? Worship will include a Call to Worship, Special Music piece, scripture, brief message and time for our project. Communion may move to the following Sunday, pending Session approval.

What ages can come? All ages! Families are encouraged to participate. Nursery and a kids option will be available for our youngest disciples.

What should I wear? This will be a "casual Sunday," so please wear clothes that are comfortable for a service project. Closed-toe shoes are recommended, and all participants will be asked to wear a hair net for the packing time for food safety considerations. Look out for Pastor Chris in shorts that Sunday!

Will we livestream? We will not livestream our full Sunday service, but Pastor Chris will pre-record a 30min service for our YouTube worshippers.

YOUR HOMESTEAD PRESBYTERY MEETING | May 18, 2023

- The meeting was held at First Presbyterian Church of Beatrice.
- Steve Piper was Moderator, and Rev. Brian Johnson led the worship service.
- The offering was dedicated for Presbyterian Peace Fellowship and the Guns to Gardens Program.
- The New Strategy Plan was approved, and the Implementation Team was introduced.
- The leadership of HP and Calvin Crest are proposing the transfer of the Calvin Crest property, owned by HP, to Calvin Crest Camp, Conference and Retreat Center. Calvin Crest is an established entity with a Board of Directors, and HP will still have representation on it. The price is \$15,000, the estimated cost of legal and other expenses HP will incur. There are fall-back provisions in the sale agreement that would revert the camp to HP under certain circumstances (i.e., buyer cannot sell the property). Camp Calvin Crest will continue to serve HP churches as it has in the past. This transaction will be voted on at the August 12, 2023, HP meeting. HP's financial support for Calvin Crest will be reduced over time.
- We extended the contracts of Erica Nelson, Stated Clerk, for three years. This was done to keep continuity during the implementation of the New Strategy Plan.
- Amendments to the PC(USA) Book of Order were approved. Thirty were approved with no discussion. Three were presented to vote on separately and discuss. The amendments include a rewrite of the former Rules of Discipline, now called the New Church Discipline. These amendments are proposed by General Assembly. Now the presbyteries vote to ratify.
- Elders Kathy Rohwedder and Margaret Sprude attended as commissioners from Westminster.



At the Last Supper, Jesus gave His friends instructions for how to live after His death and Resurrection — He washed their feet and said, "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do" (In 13:14-15).

In serving others, we not only model Jesus, but also meet Jesus in those we serve. We see Jesus in the joy of children we are mentoring. We are surprised by Jesus in the generosity of the poor. We are inspired by Jesus in the perseverance and beauty of a person with disabilities. We encounter Jesus' love as we share our lives with those we set out to serve. Volunteering is a way to make God's love real in your life and in the lives of others.*

We see how our volunteers make God's love real in all they do. We see how they live out the message Jesus came to give us and how they strive to be God's hands, God's feet, and God's voice.
