## A Message to the Congregation from Pastor Chris Peters

Westminster Family,

"Accept each other with love, and make an effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit with the peace that ties you together. You are one body and one spirit, just as God also called you in one hope. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God and Father of all, who is over all, through all, and in all." Ephesians 4:2b-6 (CEB) Birth and baptism, growth and confirmation, marriages and friendships, celebrations and losses, and yes, the transition to life eternal – our faith is deeply connected to the milestone moments in our lives. Our faith can also be connected to the day-to-day moments – when a child asks, "where does God live," when the car starts to begin the trip home after a stressful day at work, when we are thankful for a good test result, and when we pray for a friend at the end of the day. ## Westminster Pollinator Garden Project Update

Back in June on a 86 degree day, a group of about 15 Westminster members and friends gathered in the park at the corner of Normal Boulevard and South Street with trowels and gardening gloves in hand. Their mission: to set out some 250 seedlings—periwinkle, goldenrod, "Autumn Joy" sedum, and more, all chosen for their appeal to pollinators such as honey bees, bumblebees, and butterflies.

As explained by Westminster's Green@Heart team, "Over 80% of the crops that feed America depend on the work of pollinators, but their populations are declining as biodiversity loss accelerates. Climate change and habitat destruction are major contributors to biodiversity loss, and we were trying to mitigate those factors." So the volunteers planted and mulched and later came back to pull weeds. And the Parks Department irrigation system watered the plants through a dry summer. But the rest of the process was all up to nature.

So by late summer, folks were asking. Did it work? Did the plants grow? Did the pollinators come? Did the Westminster volunteers make a difference? It took a late September visit to find out.

From a yard away it was hard to tell, but just a few steps closer and the answers were wonderfully clear. Yes, yes, yes, and yes! Check out the pictures: Westminster's pollinator garden is hosting many, many honeybees and bumblebees, and they are having a glorious time at their pollinator buffet, hardly knowing which flower to sample first. There's parking in the golf course lot if you'd like to see for yourself. And no worry; the bees won't bother you. They're much too busy enjoying the feast!
