This Sunday begins the season of Advent in the church year. Advent is a season of anticipation for the arrival of Christ - both looking back to the prophets to hear anticipation at the birth of a Messiah, and in our own day, looking toward Christ's return. We light candles as signs of the growing light of Christ. Today we light the candle of hope.

From the Glory to God Hymnal notes on Hymn 90: "The refrain comes from the ecumenical Community of Taize in France. With repeated singing it can be used by itself as a contemplative prayer and is especially appropriate in Advent." We will sing this song as our sung response to the confessing of our sins each of the next four Sunday mornings.
