

Foundation Meeting Snippets, submitted by Foundation Secretary Erika Schafer. December 13, 2023 Meeting:

- --Pastor Chris provided a year-end financial report of the church budget. He thanked the Foundation for the support of the church budget and additional projects including the church concrete repair project and the new security system.
- --The Foundation voted to approve Session's request to provide \$46,000 in funds for the end of 2023 in the following categories:
- \$1,500 from Christian Education Endowment for support of the Children and Families Ministry and Church Life Ministry. \$2,500 from the Anderson Fund to support the Worship and Music Ministry.
- \$3,000 from the Bacon Music Fund and \$1,000 from the Knox Family Endowment to pay down the Sanctuary Audio Loan. \$6,000 from the Mission Endowment to support Mission and Outreach Ministry.
- \$8,000 from the Bukey Memorial Fund to support the Personnel Budget of WPC.
- \$3,000 from the Choir-Music-Radio-TV Ministry fund to support Worship and Music Ministry.
- \$1,000 from the Andrew McDonald Church Growth Fund to support Communications and Media outreach.
- \$17,000 from the Bukey Memorial Fund and \$3,000 from the General Purpose Endowment to support the Operating Budget of Westminster.
- --The sanctuary's stained glass restoration project is on-going but received \$35,000 of financial support from an insurance policy that named the Westminster Foundation as a beneficiary. The family of Don Hamann directed the funds to be used for the stained glass restoration in his memory.
- --The church received \$10,000 in additional raised funds from church members to start work on sidewalk repairs. The Foundation provided \$45,000 in funds in 2023 for the parking lot repairs.
- --The Foundation thanked outgoing Trustees Mark Schorr and Greg Hershberger for their loyal service, dedication, and guidance to the Foundation.

Green@Heart Travel Challenge A Break for Our Warming Planet

Did you fly somewhere for the holidays? Or will you be flying somewhere for a vacation this year? Remember that you can help offset the carbon emissions of your flight by contributing a modest amount to a treeplanting organization. Here's how:

- 1. Go to: carbonfootprint.com/
 calculator.aspx and enter the "to and from" information about your travel to calculate your flight's carbon emissions
- 2. Go to a reputable carbon offset group such as One Tree Planted: onetreeplanted.org/
 products/plant-trees or the Presbyterian
 presbyterianmission.org/eco-journey/presbyterian-carbon-tree-fund/ and make a donation. For example, one person's round trip flight from Lincoln to the West
 Coast and back generates 50-60 metric tons of carbon dioxide. A fair price of \$10/50 metric tons will help the organization plant trees that will clear the air of those emissions.
- 3. If you do this, please find the carbon offset box at Westminster's receptionist's desk and anonymously enter the metric tons of your trip and the amount of your donation. We'd like to track the difference we're making!

Lights Out!

Seems every family has one (usually dad)—the person who reminds everyone else to "Turn out the lights!" when leaving a room. But our church building doesn't have that person. When lights are left burning in empty rooms at Westminster they are quite literally "burning" the fossil fuels that contribute to global warming. They are also adding to the "Utilities" line item in our budget instead of items like "Children's Ministry" or "Associate Pastor."

So Westminster is starting a "Lights Out" campaign in 2024. Watch for small reminders at each light switch with this request, "Last person out, please turn off the lights." Last person in a classroom or meeting room, turn off the lights. Last person cleaning up the kitchen, turn off the lights. Last person hanging up a choir robe, turn off the lights. Offices, Fellowship Hall, the Garden Room—turn off the lights. Just channel your inner dad. It may take a little while to learn where the light switches are, but we can do this!

Holiday Recycling

Once again Green@Heart will be helping you responsibly dispose of foam packaging from holiday purchases and failed light strings. There are receptacles by the east door to collect foam. (Food containers and packing peanuts not accepted.)

We take the foam to its source in Omaha, Plastilite. They make the original foam packaging and also reuse the old to make new. It's possible that we've sent foam back and forth to them five times.
