# A Holy Week Meditation for *the Messenger*, March 2024 by Associate Pastor Jimmy Shelbourn

According to Luke 23:46, on the cross, Jesus, crying with a loud voice, commended his spirit to God the Father, and died.

In Western culture, our notion of what is meant by the word "spirit" is highly influenced by Greek philosophy ---- Plato believed that the world was illusion in the sense that the idea or essence of "tree" is more real than "a tree" – or a table or a chair or whatever. It's almost like some Oriental or Hindu concepts. This split between physical reality and essential reality is called "Platonic dualism."

Aristotle's philosophy brought a change: the perspective of the true <u>reality</u> of matter . . . And without Aristotle's understanding, I doubt that the scientific method of analyzing reality could have emerged . . . though it was not really until the 1700's that scientific thinking truly emerged.

So: as post-Aristotelians **we** do not think that trees or tables or chairs are not real. They are things and can be studied as to structure and composition. But, in regards to the concept of human spirit, even Aristotle retained Plato's dualism: a human being **has** a soul...like it is a separate part and only **a part** of us. Like we **have** a knee-cap and we **have** a stomach. And a big toe. Just parts. "Parts is parts" if you remember the old KFC commercial about unidentifiable chunks of chicken.

And common parlance, even today, reflects Aristotle's continuation of Plato's dualism even if the person-on-the-street has never read Aristotle.

But in the Hebraic concepts behind Holy Scripture, spirit is looking at the entire person, from the perspective of one's relationship to God. It is not a "part" of us that we <u>have</u>. **It is us.** When God breathed breath into the man-made-of-mud – *adam* made of *adamah* -- the man was not "given a soul" – rather the *adam* became a living soul.

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Christ's dying words, yes. But it was what Jesus had done his entire life . . . commending himself to the care and keeping of God. It was inclusive of everything that Jesus was . . . a committal of Jesus entirely to God. . . not merely a fragment of him.

I gleaned a prayer from attending worship at the Dunblane Cathedral in Scotland, a parish of the Church of Scotland. It tries to reflect such inclusivity of what we commend to God:

Lord, we commend to Your care: Our souls & our bodies; Our minds & our thoughts;
Our health & our work; Our parents, our children, our families; Our neighbors & friends;
Our life & our death. We place them all in Your hands, This day & always.

This simple prayer reminds us that as we commit everything about ourselves and our lives to God, God will faithfully respond and vindicate our trust, even as God did for Jesus the Crucified.

# The Westminster Presbyterian Church Foundation Annual Report for 2023

The Westminster Foundation provides assistance to the Church by providing funds to assist with building projects, education and mission projects. The assets as of January 1, 2023 were \$3,400,671.72 and ended the year with total assets of \$3,478,920.47. Even though this is an increase of \$78,248.75, the big news is we disbursed \$186,000.00 to the Church for designated activities. The year was especially active:

- The Foundation paid for the 10,000 meals that were packed by 130 people in the Kids Against Hunger project.
- The Trustees voted to provide \$11,440 for church maintenance and repair costs. The Facilities Endowment, Weesner Landscape Endowment and Henderson Fund provided funds for roof leak repairs, gutter cleaning, landscaping and bat remediation.
- Funds were also provided to upgrade WPC's security system.
- The Church also received \$17,000 from the Foundation for operating expenses.
- We sold one cemetery lot in Lincoln Memorial. This leaves six lots still available for purchase at reduced prices.
- Pastor Chris and Allen Wachter received financial support to attend the National Stewardship Kaleidoscope Conference in September.
- We are also so pleased the elevator to the sanctuary is now functioning. The total cost was \$140,394.50. Of that total \$84,485.11 was provided by the insurance claim. The balance of the expense provided by the Foundation was to install equipment to comply with City codes. The Facilities Endowment and the Henderson Fund were used.
- Foundation funds and private donations have paid for the stained glass window restoration projects. We also received proceeds in 2023 from a life insurance policy that had been dedicated for the restoration of the large window above the balcony.
- At the October meeting, the Trustees voted to provide up to \$89,000 for concrete repair for the parking lot repairs. Of that total, \$45,000 was authorized for 2023 priority repairs. The remainder will be disbursed in 2024.

Westminster Foundation is proud to be able to assist our Church to keep our building strong and safe and our programs viable. We think of the Foundation as a large shade tree. The tree provides shade today because a seed was planted many years ago. Our Foundation is able to provide funds today because members contributed financial gifts through the years that were invested wisely and their dollars continued to grow. We are thankful today for those gifts.
