read "Giving Basket." Ushers monitor the baskets and collect the offerings following the service. *For online giving*, scan the QR code.





# Landscaping Needs

Thank you to all who have helped with the continuing tasks on the list of landscaping needs at the church. Come when it works in your schedule.

- Follow bindweed to the ground and pull it. It's nearly impossible to get the complete root.
- If someone has a string trimmer, it's the best way to remove weeds from the concrete seams and cracks. (Without poison)
- Take a broom into the Prayer Garden and sweep mulch back off the flagstone.
- Mulch in the parking lot strips should be swept and scooped back into the planting areas.

# Lights Out! Green@Heart 2024 Campaign

Seems every family has one (usually mom or dad)—the person who reminds everyone else to "Turn out the lights!" when leaving a room. But that person doesn't live in our church building.
