An interactive session on inclusion to belonging, for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities (IDD) in the faith community. We will view a presentation by Erik Carter, PhD. and discuss where we are as a faith community in *Belonging*, inside the walls of Westminster and in our community.

Erik Carter is the Luther Sweet Endowed Chair in Disabilities at Baylor University and Executive Director of the <u>Baylor Center on</u> <u>Developmental Disabilities</u>. His research and writing focus on principle-driven and research-based strategies for promoting full participation, belonging, and valued roles for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). He is particularly interested in the intersection of faith and disability, where his work focuses on calling, equipping, and supporting churches to be places of deep embrace and contribution for individuals with IDD and their families.
