Environmental Justice

I was hungry—and you fed me.

Westminster's church-wide environmental justice study continues with a focus on Food Justice, Our November action is to LEARN and to DO. LEARN a few basics about world hunger here or by scanning the QR code. Then DO something right here at Westminster—buy fair trade coffee and chocolate on the first Sunday of each month, serve hungry people at Matt Talbot or the Gathering Place, and give to the Food Pantry! They always need canned fruit, pork and beans, tuna, and cereal.



Angel Tree

Once again Westminster is partnering with the Salvation Army Angel Tree Project. Christmas and holiday gifts from the Angel Tree are given to children from low-income families. Gifts, toys, clothing, and much more are provided for children from infants to age 12.

Starting Nov. 12, look for the Angel Tree at the top of the stairs across from the receptionist's desk. Pick a tag from the tree, shop. Return the unwrapped gifts, with the tag attached to the bag, placing them under the tree.

Gifts must be returned to the church by Dec. 12. Most people, especially children, look forward to receiving clothing and gifts over the holidays. Will you be someone's angel? Thank you, Mission & Outreach

Communion Schedule Note

Communion will be held one more time in 2024, on Sunday, November 24th, in celebration of Reign of Christ / Christ the King Sunday. This scheduling was approved by Session in accordance with Book of Order guidelines. Did you know... the PC(USA) Book of Order requires a minimum of quarterly communion celebrations for our congregations, though many are like Westminster and celebrate roughly once-a-month?



Since 1888 Presbyterian Women and friends have given to the Thank Offering, which is one of the two grant making programs of PW that support family programs and health related ministries. The money collected in 2023 funded 6 national and 2 international projects.

In our own Synod of Lakes and Prairies, \$18,000 was awarded to The Dakota Presbytery Indian Reservation to

reestablish the Welcoming of the Child ceremony. This Lakota tradition celebrates the births of babies, the training of new mothers by the elders, as well as teaching parenting skills to nurture healthy families.
