

A note from Pastor Chris on this Sunday's Service

This Sunday is Reign of Christ / Christ the King Sunday in the church calendar. For me, this means a morning of scriptures that point us to the truth – the truth that Jesus is Lord of all the Earth. For the early church, this affirmation would mean that no Roman Emperor, no King is Lord – Christ alone is Lord. The "Feast of Christ the King" was first celebrated in 1925 as a new feast in the Roman Catholic calendar. We celebrate it not as a Feast, but as a reminder of Christ's value for all nations, Christ's welcome for all people, and that Christ's reign is one of peace. Today we end a liturgical year before beginning a new year of the church calendar in Advent on Dec. 1!
