A MESSAGE TO THE CONGREGATION

Westminster Family,

From Pastor Chris

This note is being penned – or, rather, typed – shortly before the start of Advent, just a few days before Thanksgiving. I'm in a bit of a reflective mood this month, so in the spirit of one of our members who shares "Sunday Notes" on Facebook (Thanks, Pat!), here are my "Year-End Notes" of gratitude and hope as we enter the last month of 2024.

- This past Sunday we ended worship with the reminder, "you are enough," and our Moment of Gratitude was for our congregation. As we transition into the merriment, hope, sounds, tastes and smells of the holiday season, I wanted to reiterate my gratitude for our congregation. In all seasons you have been supportive of our work together, willing to try new things like Service of Service and A Sanctified Art worship series. (More on our Advent series a few notes down!). Your care for Westminster and welcome of this blended SC/GA family, now with a silly toddling native Nebraskan, has meant the world to me... and to us. Thank you!
- This fall has flown, hasn't it? This fall we marked the beginning of year five together. From the strangest Installation service ever in the parking lot to today, it has been quite a journey. I think that's been touched by God's grace all along the way. This fall I also marked 10 years of ordained service and 22 years of church work. I wonder what milestones you experienced this fall. Whether they're milestones of joy or they're bittersweet, I'd love to hear from you about your own milestones heading into winter.
- Advent 2024 will find us in the Words for the Beginning series from A Sanctified Art. Here's a little about the theme from their team: Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.
- Every church I've served before Westminster used purple for Advent. I've got to say, I really love our choice of blue. The stole (scarf-looking thing pastors wear) I started wearing last year is from a liturgical artist and purchased with a kind gift for my 2-year celebration from the Foundation. It might be my favorite of all my stoles, and not just due to the color.
- Stewardship season continues this year, with a slightly later pattern, which was intentional. In addition to the Messenger, you should receive a stewardship packet this week. I hope you'll join us on Sunday, December 8th for Commitment Sunday, our Advent Celebration after worship and another baptism! What a joy and a privilege we have had celebrating five baptisms of little ones in November and December!
- May we all, with joy and hope, look toward the good news of great joy for the little one we will celebrate at the end of Advent. I hope to see you soon in worship and on Christmas Eve at 5:00 and 7:00pm.
