

California on a Plate: A Community Effort to Support Wildfire Relief What is "California on a Plate"?

"California on a Plate" is an exciting potluck-style event inspired by the U.S. version of "World on a Plate." This is a chance to come together as a community and share dishes that represent California's vibrant culinary landscape, including favorites like fish tacos, avocado toast, California sushi rolls, and sourdough bread. The idea is to bring people together through food, celebrate the unique flavors of our state, and raise support for wildfire relief.

How can you participate? Simply start googling California-inspired recipes, make your dish, and bring it to share with others. The event will also provide an opportunity to learn more about the ongoing efforts of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) and the work they're doing to support those affected by the fires. We'll have a "bread basket" available where attendees can make a monetary donation to support the PDA's wildfire relief efforts.

If you utilize orange Hefty bags with your collections service, that's where egg cartons, food containers and packing peanuts can go.

When can you bring foam for recycling?
