An Opportunity to Speak Up

"Green Team" representatives of sixteen different Lincoln churches got together on a Sunday afternoon in January to consider the possibility of collaborating on some climate-worthy project. After a good discussion of options, the group reached consensus on supporting a bill in the Nebraska

legislature. LB137 seeks to protect homeowners' rights to install solar panels and plant pollinator gardens for their own homes. Specifically, it bars HOAs (Home Owners Associations) from prohibiting them.

Westminster's Green@Heart is fully in support of this legislation, and we encourage you to look up the bill and see if you would like to send the legislature a comment online. We are called to tend and to keep God's creation. Both practices protected by this bill—helping pollinators and generating clean energy—make important contributions to the care of our one and only planet and to the future of its inhabitants.

Commenting is a fairly quick and easy process.

• Go to <u>nebraskalegislature.gov</u> to access the legislature's homepage. In the upper right corner enter the number of the bill (137) and Return.



- This will take you to a page with information about the bill and a "Submit Comment" button.
- That button takes you to the comment page where you can fill in the usual blanks (name, address, etc.) and enter your position on the bill.
- Your written comment may be as simple as "I support/ oppose this bill" or a longer statement about the bill.
- You will receive a return email with a link to press that confirms your comment.
- Note that comments are due no later than 8 AM Thurs. Feb. 27.

One of the most important things we can do to care for creation is to speak up. Green@Heart hopes you will seize this opportunity to use your voice!
