Glenna Haller Represents PW at the United Nations

Westminster member, Glenna Haller, will have the opportunity and privilege to represent Presbyterian Women (PW) as a delegate to the 69th session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) March 10-21 in New York City. In 2018, Presbyterian Women received accreditation to the CSW with voice and vote thus strengthening the partnership between PW and the PC(USA) and enhancing Presbyterian visibility at the UN.

During the Commission's annual two-week session, representatives will gather to discuss the progress and gaps in the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and

Platform for Action, the key global policy document on gender equality created 30 years ago, as well as learn about emerging issues that affect gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. The outcomes and concrete recommendations for action will then be forwarded to the UN Economic and Social Council. Many side events bring global women together to provide additional opportunities for advocacy, information exchange, and networking.
